From the Desk of the Principal



I am thrilled to announce that the Gossaigaon B.Ed. College, a self-financed college, has been accredited by NAAC grade B and has also been included under section 2 (f) & 12 B of the UGC Act, 1956 and recognised by NCTE.

This College was established on 30th April 1995 with a motto – **“Quality and Security”** and vision – to establish this institute a **“Centre of Excellence”** for teacher’s training.

The College offers 2 year B.Ed., 2 year D.El.Ed., 4 year F.Y.U.G.P. (B.A.), 4 year I.T.E.P. B.A.B.Ed. Courses and P.G. (ODL) in the subjects Sociology, English and Mass Communication & Journalism, Diploma in Human Resource Management, Diploma in Environmental & Disaster Management and in Child Rights & Governance, 3 Months Yoga Certificate Course, 3 months spoken English, 3 month Certificate Course in Computer Application (CCA), 6 months Diploma in Computer Application Course (DCA) and Certificate Course in Beautician – 3 months.

The class of the college were formally inaugurated on 12th September, 1995 by Mr. Japendra Nath Narzary, the then Director of Education, Bodoland Autonomous Council, Kokrajhar, Assam. Mr. S.R. Roy, Principal of Kokrajhar Govt. CTE graced the occasion as guest of honour. The college in its initial stage was started in the campus of Gossaigaon Boy’s H.S. School with the benevolent founder academic staff headed by Mr. Guneswar Mushahary as Principal-in-charge and lecturers namely- Mrs. Anima Narzary, Mr. Malin Bhattacharjee, Mrs. Anu Rani Brahma, Mrs. Labanya Lahkar, Mr. Sarbeswar Ch. Roy, Mrs. Nilima Brahma and Guest Lecturers- Mr. Sonaram Baglary, Mr. Ramadhar Singh and Mr. Ganapati Brahma.

The college was permitted to set up a B.Ed. College in the year 1998 by the Gauhati University vide letter no. GU/AFF/Pr/98/1119 Dated 26-03-1998 and initially recognized by NCTE Bhubaneswar on conditions in the session 2000-2001 vide order No. 191 Dated 11-01-2001/Letter No. F No. ERC-09/30/2011/1241 Dated X-4-2001/01-05-2001. The college

obtained affiliation from G.U. in the session 1998-99 vide letter NO. GU/AFF/2006-2371 Dated 04-08-2006. The college was formally recognized by N.C.T.E., Bhubaneswar (vide letter No. ERC/7.54/(ER-54 .6(a) 2/2005/835(1) Dated March 18-2005).

For conducting B.Ed. programme of two-year duration from the academic session 2015-2016 the N.C.T.E., E.R.C. Bhubneswar granted recognition vide order no F.ERC / N.C.T.E. / APE00216 / B.Ed. (Revised Order)/2015/31855.

It is to be mentioned that social workers and political leaders had extended their noble help and co-operation in the development of this college. Mr. Tojen Narzary, the then MLA, 28th Gossaigaon constituency extended his helping hand by granting of Rs. 2 (two) Lakhs from MLA (A.D), Development Fund in the year 1995-96. The Bodoland Territorial Council has allotted 9 bighas 16 lechas from general Khas in the name of Gossaigaon B.Ed. College. Sjt. Hargama Mohilary the then hon'ble Chief of B.T.C. granted financial assistance for the construction of R.C.C. building 24th December, 2019.

The ground floor of the same building was inaugurated by Sjt. Hagrama Mohilary, the then hon'ble Chief of B.T.C. on 05-01-2010 and 1st floor was inaugurated by Sjt. Derhasat Basumatary, the then hon'ble E.M., Education of B.T.C. and on 7/2/2013 B.T.C. again granted financial assistance for the construction of two additional classrooms in the year 2015 and the same was completed in the month of July/2015.

As we know teachers are not only the universal provider of useful information but also the social engineer. The teacher can design, build, maintain, control, contrive, originate, arrange and transmit folkways and mores. It makes me feel proud that E.R.C., N.C.T.E., has also granted recognition to this college vide order No. F. No. ER-239.6.64/ERCAPP3355/D. El. Ed./2017/52911 dated 02-05-2017 for conducting D. El. Ed. course of two years duration with an intake 50 (one basic unit) from the academic session 2017-18. It is really a matter of proud that the Director of Education, B.T.C. Vide memo No. DE/BTC/42/2017/519 dated 17th June 2019 accorded NOC for opening of Degree Course (Arts) at Gossaigaon B.Ed. College. Accordingly, the 3-year B.A. Course and Four Year Undergraduate Programme (F.Y.U.G.P.) course has been offering in the college. Moreover, it is a proud moment that ERC, N.C.T.E. has granted recognition to this college vide order No. F. No. NCTE / ERC / 262720250507 / 38830 / ASSAM / 2025 dated 29/10/2026 for conducting Integrated Teacher Education Programme (I.T.E.P.) Course of 4 years duration with an intake 100 seats from the academic session 2026-27.

Giving utmost importance in education sector especially in Teacher Education Institution Sri Hagrama Mahilary, the then hon'ble Chief of B.T.C. granted another 3 storied RCC building for Administrative and Academic purpose for which foundation stone was laid by Sri Hagrama Mahilary, hon'ble Chief B.T.C. on 18th April 2017 and the same was inaugurated on 24th December 2019. Sri Jiron Basumatary, the hon'ble MLA and President Governing Body granted additional classroom for I.T.E.P. which was inaugurated on 28th January, 2026. I am also thankful to Sri Pramod Boro, the then C.E.M., B.T.R. for providing infrastructure to the college such as solar panel, smart board, printer, xerox machine, desktop, projector and sound box. Now the college has good number of infrastructures including R.C.C./Assam type classroom, playground, Assam Type boys' hostel, R.C.C. & Assam Type girls' hostel, canteen, drinking water, library, I.C.T. 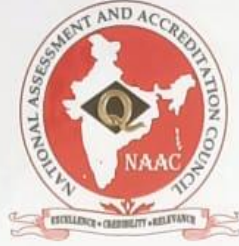



ORDER

WHEREAS, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of Section 32 of the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 (73 of 1993), and in supersession of the National Council for Teacher Education [Recognition Norms and Procedure] Regulations, 2009, the National Council for teacher Education has notified the Regulations, 2014 on 01.12.2014.

2. **AND WHEREAS** the institution viz. **Gossaigaon B.Ed. College, Habrubil (Nepalpara) Gossaigaon, P.O. Gossaigaon, Dist. Kokrajhar, Assam-783360** was granted recognition for conduct of **B.Ed.** course of **one** year duration with an annual intake of **100 from the academic session 2005-2006** vide ERC order no. **ERC/7-54/(ER-54.6(a).2)/2005/835 dt. 18.03.2005.**

3. **AND WHEREAS**, the institution viz. Gossaigaon B.Ed. College, Habrubil (Nepalpara) Gossaigaon, P.O. Gossaigaon, Dist. Kokrajhar, Assam-783360 has by affidavit dated **22.01.2015** consented to come under New Regulations 2014 and sought for **two basic units in B.Ed. course** which require additional facilities.

4. **AND WHEREAS**, it has been decided to permit the institution to have two basic units of 50 students each subject to fulfilling following conditions namely,

- (i) The institution shall create additional facilities that include (a) additional built-up area, (b) additional infrastructure, (c) additional fund, (d) adhere to staff norms as per Regulations, 2014 and inform Regional Committee with required documents by October 31, 2015.
- (ii) The applicant-institution for additional unit will be required to submit the required documents such as land documents, Encumbrance Certificate (EC), Land Use Certificate (LUC) and the Building Plan (BP) in the specified proforma available on the website to the Regional Committee in proof of having provided additional facilities before October 31, 2015. Building Completion Certificate (BCC) may be given along with other documents if available, otherwise it can also be given to the Visiting Team at the time of inspection.

- (iii) The Regional Committee shall arrange for verification of documents, inspection of these premises and check adherence to these conditions by 20 Feb, 2016. If it is found by the Regional Committee that the institution fails to comply with these requirements, the institutions shall not be permitted to admit students for the academic year 2016-2017.

5. **Now therefore**, in the light of the above and in terms of Section 14(3) (a) of NCTE Act and in accordance with the Regulations, 2014, the Eastern Regional Committee, NCTE hereby grants recognition to **Gossaigaon B.Ed. College, Habrubil (Nepalpara) Gossaigaon, P.O. Gossaigaon, Dist. 

The college has its own plot of land measuring 11 B 2 K and 1 L (7.13 acre) and has also spacious R.C.C. and Assam Type buildings.

As the college campus is away from the din and bustle of the main town Gossaigaon, a calm and quiet atmosphere prevails in the campus. The college is catering the educational needs of the local people, particularly in the field of teachers training and the college is rendering valuable services to the professional development of teachers.

Essential Information

Admission Procedure:

1. Admission Process: As per norms and procedures of Bodoland University and SCERT in regard to admission into the B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. course respectively, the applying candidates will have to qualify the entrance test centrally conducted by the affiliated body and admission for B.A. course will be on the first come first serve basis. The applicants will fulfil the norms of the college, affiliating body in matter of admission.

2. Courses offered and intake capacity: The College, at present offers three courses that is, two years B.Ed. course (Semester System) under Bodoland University, D.El.Ed. course under S.C.E.R.T. Assam and Four Year Under Graduate Programme course under Bodoland University.

As per NCTE norms total intake capacity is 100 (hundred) seats for 2 years B.Ed. course and 50 (Fifty) seats for the 2 years D.El.Ed. Course, 60 (sixty) seats for each honours subject for B.A. four years degree (F.Y.U.G.P.) course, for 4 years I.T.E.P. course 100 (hundred) seats, for the 3 (three) months yoga certificate course 50 (fifty) seats, 3 (three) month (CCA) Certificate Course in Computer Application 100 (hundred) seats and for 3 (three) months Spoken English Course 100 (hundred) seats.

3. Eligibility:

- a) Eligibility for 2 Years B.Ed. Course- Graduation or above with 50% marks.
- b) Eligibility for 2 Years D.El.Ed. Course- Higher Secondary with 50% marks.
- c) Eligibility for 4 Years Undergraduate Course- (FYUGP) Higher Secondary passed.
- d) Eligibility for 4 Years I.T.E.P. course- Higher Secondary with 50% marks.

Eligibility: Bachelor's Degree in any discipline.

4. Relaxation of marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST/OBC/MOBC) shall be given relaxation up to 5% (five percent) of the marks prescribed for admission. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

5. Reservation of seats: Reservation for Permanent Residents of Assam for both the programs (course) will be as per reservation policy of affiliating body.

6. Date of admission: Course wise Date of admission will be notified in the College website and notice board. Admission of waiting list candidates will be held on the date notified by the college after the completion of the admission of selected candidates.

7. Submission of Affidavits on Ragging: All admitted trainees will have to fill two anti-ragging affidavits through online mode (www.antiragging.in) one for Trainee himself/herself and another for the guardian and the filled affidavits hard copy is to be submitted to the in-charge of anti-ragging cell within the one month after admission into the course.

8. Commencement of Classes: The class for B.Ed., D. El. Ed. F.Y.U.G.P. & I.T.E.P. Courses will start as per instruction of affiliating body.

9. Cancellation of seats: A trainee failing to attend classes for one week (6 days) at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his/her seat.

10. Class Attendance of Trainees / Student: Attendance of trainees/students in the class, practice teaching, group discussion etc. are compulsory. The trainees/students attending individual classes up to 75% or above in all B.Ed., F.Y.U.G.P., I.T.E.P. and D.El.Ed. classes are allowed to appear in the final examination. The trainees/students are required to attend compulsorily in the programme of home assignment and internal assessment arranged and conducted by the college from time to time.

11. Discipline: The trainees admitted to the college must abide by the rules and regulations of the college. Violation of the rules and regulation, irregular attendance, irregular payment of college dues, showing misbehaviour to the teachers and employees in any form, adopting unfair means during examination, causing damage to the college properties, smoking, taking alcoholic beverages and intoxicating drinks within the college campus are some of the offences which may make trainees/students liable for disciplinary action.

12. College Office Hour: The working hour of the college is from 10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. and the classes for B.Ed., F.Y.U.G.P., I.T.E.P. and D.El.Ed. starts from 10:00 A.M. onwards. The college remains closed on state Govt. holidays and according to the Bodoland University academic calendar and also three more restricted holidays selected by the College.

13. Scholarship: Scholarship for the trainees/students belonging to ST/ SC/ OBC/MOBC can be applied to the concerned authority. Candidates belonging to reserve quota can apply for the same in the prescribed application form through online mode after getting admission into the course.

14. Educational tour/ excursion: The trainees/students of the college are encouraged to go to educational excursion, tour and picnic.

15. Identity Card: The college Identity Card is issued for one academic session on payment. Those trainees who have lost their identity card may ask for duplicate identity card on extra payment. Admitted trainees/students must put on the Identity Card mandatorily during the college hour.

16. Library Card: After the admission trainees/students have to issue a library card from the librarian of the college duly signed by the Principal of the College to borrow books from library for a prescribed period of time. Library caution money (refundable) is to be deposited by all the trainees.

17. Practice Teaching & Internship Classes: The college arrange practice teaching & internship classes in the neighbouring feeder schools for one month and four months respectively which are to be done by all the trainees of B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. compulsorily. The college has already obtained NOC from the feeder schools to conduct practice teaching and internship classes for both B.Ed. & D. El. Ed. course.

18. Hostel accommodation: The college has one Assam Type Boy's Hostel with 10 seats capacity, Assam Type Girls' Hostel with 10 seats, R.C.C. type Girls' Hostel with 14 seats and are allotted on the merit basis and distance of beyond 20 k.m. radius from the Gossaigaon B.Ed. College. The process of selection for accommodation will begin only after admission. The college hostel will provide minimum facilities in the matter of utensils, furniture's, newspaper etc. There are certain rules and regulations in the hostel and all the boarders will have to follow these strictly.

19. College Canteen: The college has Assam Type Canteen within its campus for all the members of the college where one can have well cooked and hygienic food.

20. Visitors Room: College has its own well decorated room for the visitors.

21. Flower Garden: The college has developed a flower garden within the college campus in the name of Sundar Majhi. Seasonal flowers, plantation is planted by the college and trainees for the beautification of the garden.

22. Administrative Office : The college has administrative office where the working hours of office staffs are from 10:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

23. Multipurpose Hall : The multipurpose hall (size 2038.46 sq.ft) in the college is a versatile, large scale facility designed to accommodate a wide range of academic, cultural extracurricular activities.

24. Language and ICT Lab: The college has an air conditioned, well furniture, well decorated Language and ICT Lab room, having 15 nos. of computers and software necessary for the language learning.

25. Psychological Lab: The college has a psychological lab room having all the required psychological kits necessary for the learning purpose.

26. Curriculum Lab: The college has a curriculum lab room having all the required curriculum kits needed for the learning purpose. In the Curriculum Lab Lesson Plan, Unit Plan, Text Book of different classes of SEBA syllabus are included.

27. Seminar/Workshop/Orientation/Debate: The IQAC of the college organizes seminars and workshops time to time in each academic session. Class Seminar/ Workshop/ Group Discussions/ Debate are also arranged which are an integral part of internal assessment.

28. Trainees Union: The trainees of the college have their own trainee's union with the principal as the president known as Gossaigaon B.Ed. College Trainees Union. Seat of G.S. Union Body is reserved for deputed teachers only. If there are no deputed teachers the post of general secretary for trainees' union will be opened for all to be selected and supported by the majority. In case there is proposal of more than one candidate for the post of general secretary, the Principal/Vice-Principal will reserve the right to decide.

There are Lecturer-in-charge for different sections to guide and help the union in all matters. The Trainees Union organizes Fresher's Social Day, Annual College Week, Picnic and Excursion cum Educational Tour and etc. There is also a Trainee's Union office from where the assigned task are exercised.

29. Co-curricular activities: The college also organizes co-curricular activities for all round development of trainees such as Physical Activities, Cultural Activities, Literary Activities, Social Service Activities and Group Discussion etc.

30. Publication: The college publishes Giyan-Lu an Annual College Magazine and has got four multilingual wall magazine name as तमसो मा ज्योतिर्गमय (Tamsa Ma Jyotirgamay) for the ground floor, सरस्वती (Saraswati) for 1st floor, ज्ञान दर्शन (Gyan Darshan) for boys' hostel and Students Corner for Administrative building, which is being published yearly for cultivating writing and reading culture.

31. Girls' Common Room: The college has provided the facility of common room for the Girls' trainees and students.

32. Boys Common Room: The college has provided the facility of common room for the Boys trainees and students.

33. College Library: The college has a modern and well stocked library with a total collection of about 6580 copies of reference and general books specially based on the educational, methodology of teaching, ICT and periodicals, newspapers, journals and magazines etc. for B.Ed., D. El. Ed., F.Y.U.G.P. and I.T.E.P. Course. Trainees and students can borrow books from the library for a prescribed period of time. It has reading room facility.



SYLLABUS FOR TWO-YEAR B.ED. COURSE UNDER BODOLAND UNIVERSITY

Introduction: The Programme comprises of three board curricular areas: Perspective in Education, Curriculum and Pedagogic Studies and Engagement with the field. As per guide lines of the “Curriculum Framework: Two-year B.Ed. Programme” Circulated by National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) in 2014, the following courses are designed for B.Ed. Programme of the Bodoland University, Kokrajhar, BTAD, Assam

Perspective in Education (Core course):

Core courses are intended to provide a conceptual understanding of relevant concepts and processes in Teacher-Education and also situate them in the broader perspective of education and development. These are mandatory subjects for all student-teachers.

1. CC1: Childhood and Growing Up
2. CC2: Contemporary India and Education
3. CC3: Language across the Curriculum
4. CC4: Understanding Disciplines and Subjects
5. CC5 : Learning and Teaching
6. CC7 : (a & b): Knowledge and Curriculum
7. CC8: Gender, School and Society
8. CC9: Creating an Inclusive School

Curriculum and Pedagogic Studies (School Subjects) : Courses in pedagogic studies are aimed at providing and understanding of the dynamics and complexities in teaching-learning situations, including familiarity with the basic terms and concepts various alternatives possible, technical insights into putting curricular aspects in operation as well as various ways of assessing learning. In consonance with the overall framework, emphasis is laid on the constructivist views in all these dimensions, with appropriate exposure to other views, whenever necessary. It also aims to develop in student-teachers and understanding of the curriculum, linking school knowledge with community life. The design of the programme will enable the students to specialize in one disciplinary area, viz. social science, Science, Mathematics, Language and subject are from the same discipline, at one/two levels of schools.

1. **CC6: Pedagogy of a School Subject Optional Courses*:** Apart from conceptual and practical learning gained through core courses and pedagogic studies, student-teachers need to develop other dimensions of their sensibilities. They need to experience and internalize the fact that the teacher is much more than someone who teaches a subject. The teacher is also potentially a participant in the wider education system and he/she may play a proactive role both in the community life of the school and also in the broader social context. In this sense he/she is capable of becoming an agent of social development, even of social transformation. In order to empower the student-teachers in these dimensions, it is necessary that they are provided with arrange of experiences that will cumulatively enrich them as well as develop their sensivity. Course 11* is attempted to satisfy this need.

Engagement with field

Task and Assignments: This is a part and parcel of all the courses which is included in the programme to stabilize their theoretical knowledge with different divergent activities. Task and assignments for courses of respective subjects will be selected by the concerned College and submission/performance of such items will be according to the respective College calendar.

Enhancement of Professional Capacity (EPC): These courses are included to train a student's teacher to be effective and enhance their professional activities as a teacher by developing their extra efforts required for present education transaction. Following are the courses offered for this purpose.

Following are the courses offered for this purpose.

1. EPC 1: Reading and reflecting on Texts
2. EPC 2: Drama and Art in education
3. EPC 3: Critical Understanding of ICT
4. EPC 4: Understanding the Self

School Internship: For School Internship, a student teacher should work as a regular for duration of 20 weeks of which 2 weeks each in first and second semester as preparatory and 16 weeks in third semester participating in all activities (academic, non- academic, management, evaluation and other co-curricular activities) of the school. The School Internship will realize the student- teachers how to cop-up with practical implementation of School Education. The details of the course are shown in the school Internship.

Assessment: For perspective in education and pedagogic studies 25% marks is assigned for continuous internal and 70% for external assessment in a full course whereas 30% for internal assessment and 70% for assessment for a half course. Assessments for EPC are 100% internal. The design of internal assessment will be flexible but structured in its own. The minimum pass marks is 40%.

Duration: The maximum duration of the course completion is 3 (three) consecutive years.

Gossaigaon B.Ed. College

(Official Administrative Guidelines)

The Aims and Objectives of the Trainees' Union shall be:

- To contribute to the overall development of the College.
- To promote the academic, cultural and professional development of trainees and students.
- To assist in maintaining and upholding the rules, discipline and guidelines of the College.
- To maintain unity in diversity amongst the students.

I. Title

These guidelines shall be known as the “Guidelines for Trainees’ Union, Gossaigaon B.Ed. College” and shall be applicable to all trainees of the college for the concerned academic session.

II. Nature of the Union

The Trainees’ Union shall function as a representative body of trainees to assist in academic, cultural, social and co-curricular activities of the college under the supervision of the college authority.

III. Patron & Advisory Authority

- The Principal of the College shall be the President of the Trainees’ Union.
- The Vice-Principal of the College shall be the Vice-President of the Trainees’ Union.
- The President and Vice-President shall act as the supreme advisory and controlling authority of the Union.

IV. Administrative Control

The Trainees’ Union shall function strictly under the supervision of the College Authority.

The Principal and Vice-Principal shall reserve full rights of:

- Expulsion
- Termination
- Reshuffle
- Reconstitution of the Union at any time as and when deemed necessary in the interest of discipline and institutional functioning.

V. General Secretary (Special Provision)

- The post of General Secretary shall be reserved for a Deputed Teacher to be selected/approved by the students with the consent of the College Authority.
- The final approval of the General Secretary shall rest with the Principal/Vice-Principal.
- In case no deputed teacher is available, the House may select any trainee as General Secretary.

Such selection shall be irrespective of:

- Class
- Gender
- Course (B.Ed., D.El.Ed., F.Y.U.G.P., I.T.E.P. etc.)
- Sex or category

However, the selected candidate must maintain good conduct and academic discipline.

- They shall guide and monitor all union activities.

VIII. Tenure

- The tenure of the Trainees' Union shall normally be for one Academic Session.
- The tenure may be modified or dissolved earlier by the College Authority if required.

IX. Selection/Election Process

- The selection of office bearers may be conducted through:
- Selection by House, or
- Nomination by College Authority, or
- A combination of both.
- Final approval of all posts shall be subject to the consent of the Principal.

X. Duties and Responsibilities

The Union shall:

- Ensure mandatory participation and support in the conduct of morning assembly as per college norms.
- Assist in the observance of important State and National days as directed by the College Authority.
- Maintain discipline and decorum in the college.
- Assist in academic, cultural, sports, and social activities.

- Organize college events, functions, and observances.
- Promote unity, cooperation, and leadership among trainees.
- Act as a liaison between trainees and college authority (through proper channel only).

XI. Code of Conduct

- All office bearers must maintain proper discipline and attendance.
- No activity shall be conducted without prior permission of the College Authority.
- Misconduct, indiscipline, or misuse of position may lead to removal from the Union.
- Political, unlawful, or anti-institutional activities are strictly prohibited.

XII. Meetings

- Union meetings shall be held with prior permission of the Principal/Vice-Principal.
- Emergency meetings may be called with the approval of the President or Vice-President.

XIII. Financial Matters (If Applicable)

- Any fund collection shall require prior written approval from the Principal.
- Proper records of income and expenditure must be maintained.
- Accounts shall be subject to verification by the College Authority.

XIV. Amendment Clause

The College Authority reserves the right to amend, modify, or update these guidelines at any time for the smooth functioning of the institution.

XV. Final Authority

The decision of the Principal, Gossaigaon B.Ed. College, shall be final and binding in all matters related to the Trainees' Union.
